

Brown Annex

Offenders are placed in the program and removed at the Courts discretion.

The Brown Annex is considered a supervision and treatment provider by the Courts and an alternative to jail or prison incarceration.

Intake

The average length of the Offenders Court Ordered supervision may be from 11 months and 29 days (misdemeanor) or 1 year – 10 years (Felony Offenders.)

Referrals

Placed in Brown Annex by:

Offenders are considered successful completions if they are not revoked and placed in prison during their residential stay and have completed the required treatment plan while at the Brown Annex
